

ill was born in Harbour Island and grew up in Governor's Harbour, Eleuthera. He received his early education at the Primary School in Governor's Harbour, and later at Queen's College High School in Nassau.



Bill attended Trinity Methodist Church when he first moved to Nassau, but joined Ebenezer when his family moved to Nassau from Eleuthera. He was received as a member in September 1967 by the Rev. Harold Ward. Ebenezer holds a special place in Bill's heart -- he and Lauren were married here, their children were christened here, and their parents were buried here. Ebenezer is where he began ministry... serving in the Sunday School, Youth Ministry, Junior Church, Music Ministry, and Preaching.

As a candidate for the Methodist ministry, he trained at the *United Theological College* of the West Indies and the University of the West Indies, in Kingston, Jamaica. He later did graduate studies at Bethune-Cookman University, Florida, USA. He pastored Methodist Churches in Jamaica and in Eleuthera from 1978 to 1998, and has been minister of Trinity Methodist Church, Nassau, since 1999.

Bill served in several areas of leadership in the Bahamas Conference of the Methodist Church, including a term as President, and has served as Chaplain to the House of Assembly. He is a Justice of the Peace, a Director of the Bahamas Alzheimer's Association, and is certified in Mediation and International Arbitration.

Bill is married to Lauren (Major), and they have 2 children, Rory (Zerifeh) Higgs and Kara (Philip) Smith, and 2 granddaughters, Ciella and Zaria.

Under the theme, 'Unity In Community...Forward in Taith', we celebrate the 220

In response to God's call, the Rev. William Turton, after a five-month trip from Antigua, arrived on the island of New Providence, October 1800. Upon his arrival, he began to have open-air meetings in Eastern Nassau. His ministry was met with much opposition but Rev. Turton laboured diligently in the work to which he was called.

As the work in the eastern section of the town began to prosper, there was a need for a permanent place of worship. Those to whom Rev. Turton ministered, were unable to provide the needed funds to construct a building, and there was no assistance or support, for the work from the British Conference, which had sent Rev. Turton.

Rev. Turton, from his meager personal funds, took £240, and built a wooden 'meeting place', where his followers could meet. That wooden structure, constructed in October 1802, which was known as the 'East Chapel', was the genesis of Ebenezer Methodist Church.

Ebenezer, therefore, came into existence through an act of sacrifice, and that spirit of sacrifice has continued down through these 220 years. That spirit of sacrifice has been seen in the lives of the clergy and laity, as together, they have laboured, to keep the flame of faith alive and burning here at Ebenezer. As a result of that act of sacrifice, countless families and communities throughout The Commonwealth of The Bahamas, have been touched by, and through, the ministry of Ebenezer.

The sacrifices made by Rev. Turton, the ministers that followed him, and the Ebenezer laity over these many years, were made to serve God and the people of God. That spirit of service, begun in 1802, has remained unbroken for 220 years.

Though some of the names may have changed, those avenues of service, have continued through wide and varied ministries, faithfully undertaken by those committed to the preaching and teaching of the Word.



The Ancient Israelites were in the wilderness, as they journeyed to the Promised Land, for forty long years. And during that period of time, God supernaturally supplied their needs and sustained them, for those forty years.

Likewise, Ebenezer, has been supernaturally sustained for 220 years, through the faithful stewardship of God's people. In the good and bad times, the highs and lows, the ups and downs, the doors of Ebenezer have remained and will remain open in service and ministry to Christ.

The God, who has been faithful over these 220 years, will continue to be faithful in blessing His people, so that they, in turn, will support and sustain His work.





THE STORY OF STEADFASTNESS

Ebenezer has remained strong and steadfast over these 220 years. Despite failures and flaws, she has continued forward in faith.


Just eleven years after the wooden East Chapel was built, it was partially destroyed by a hurricane in 1813. The Chapel was rebuilt and was soon outgrown by the attendance. The foundation stone, for the present Ebenezer Church, was laid on March 29, 1839.

Two years later, in 1841, the new Ebenezer Methodist Church opened its doors for worship and by 1851, she boasted a membership of 336 members. The beautiful edifice weathered the terrible storm of 1866, which badly damaged many churches in New Providence.

However, the devastating hurricane of 1929 extensively damaged the present Ebenezer Church, but, again, Ebenezer regrouped and by combining insurance payments, donations and the hard work of members and friends, Ebenezer was restored to its former glory.

And from then to now, many improvements have been made to the interior and exterior of the church. In the 1960s, the floors and pews of the church were renewed; the choir stalls and pulpit were rearranged.

The construction of the new Epworth Hall and Educational Centre was completed and dedicated on November 25,1984.
